Jim Prentice's 12 Steps to Format Shifting

Under Bill C-61, Canadians will still be able to digitize photos, books, newspaper articles, VHS and other works for all their archiving needs. Of course, they'll have to check off these TWELVE items first.

1.	You received the original copy legally.	
2.	You are <i>not</i> renting or borrowing the original.	
3.	You own the medium to which you are digitizing.	
4.	You don't circumvent any digital locks to make your digital copy.	
5.	You don't print more than one copy of the work - if it is in digital form.	
6.	You make only one copy per device you own.	
7.	You do not give the copy away.	
8.	You only use the copy for private purposes.	
9.	You destroy ALL copies if you give away, rent or sell the original work.	
10.	You did not digitize it to communicate it to the public by "telecommunication."	
11.	You did not copy it to perform it, or cause it to be performed in public.	
12.	You did not digitize it to sell, rent trade or distribute it.
